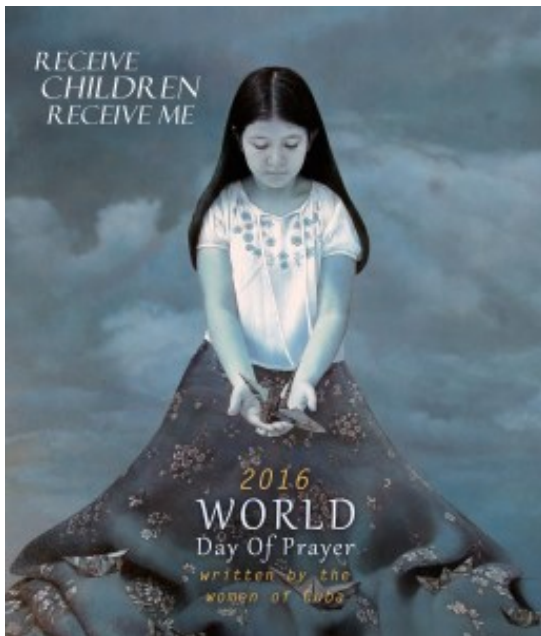

“THE REAL ‘F’ WORD...”

Even if that person wrongs you seven times a day and each time turns again and asks forgiveness, you must forgive.” – *Jesus*, as recorded in Luke 17:4 (NLT)

Dear members & friends of Trinity UMC,

Easter’s coming! Did you know that? And do you know what date it is? (I asked someone that the other day and their response was, “It’s on Sunday again, isn’t it?” Well, yeah...) Hopefully March 27th is already marked on your personal or family calendars, since Easter is such an important date in the life of the Church (that’s us!). And yes, it’s about family gatherings, and the ham dinner, and dressing up in spring colors. But, mostly Easter is *resurrection day*. *It’s the day God came through for Jesus!* Jesus trusted God with his life ... and God came through! It’s the day God’s power in Jesus overcame death ... and he was resurrected. And because of what happened to Jesus, we now know that God’s resurrection power can be real in our lives too! We can trust God with our lives, God will come through for us, and we too can know God’s power of LOVE in our lives—even through our own death & resurrection!

What Jesus really did for us was take our place as the perfect (sinless) sacrifice—giving his life that we might know God’s *forgiveness* in our lives. So, in a way, it seems like *forgiveness is really what this season is all about*. With that in mind, on Easter morning, we’re going to start a new worship series on forgiveness. In the short time I’ve been in Lomira, this is the one topic—by far—that I’ve had requests to preach on. It’s something many people struggle with. We understand forgiveness to a point, but what is God’s view of forgiveness, and how do we live that out in our lives? We’re going to be talking about all of these things, beginning on Easter morning, March 27th, and then continuing on through the month of April.

Here are some more specifics of what we’ll be covering: There are 3 levels of forgiveness that we’re going to explore during ‘The Real F Word’ series...

3rd level: FORGIVING OURSELVES—
one of the hardest forms of forgiveness to actually do...

2nd level: FORGIVING OTHERS—
especially why it’s so important for both them and us...

The Ultimate Level: FORGIVENESS WE RECEIVE FROM GOD—
coming to a solid understanding of what Jesus really did for us and why it’s changed our lives forever...

Folks, you’re not going to want to miss out on this very exciting teaching starting on Easter morning! So, who do you know who could benefit from learning more about *forgiveness*? Who do you know who’s been holding a grudge for way too long and it’s affecting their life, maybe even their health, in negative ways? It’s time to not only learn more about forgiveness yourself; it’s also time to invite those who could benefit from this teaching to come to worship with you! Pray about it, would you? I know God will open doors for all of us to be able to do just that...

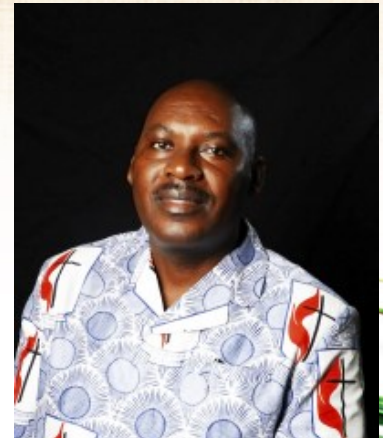

“FAITH”

Having focused on sacrifice for several months, (although it may have been as much or more about faith than sacrifice) I began thinking about a subject for March. But, again, God put the subject right out there where I almost stumbled over it.

While attempting to rid my “office” of extraneous papers and “stuff”, I came to a typed letter on green stationery. It was written to my dad and signed by my mother’s youngest sister on June 3, 1975, two months after Mom had died. Wondering why I had kept it, I started reading... Several paragraphs were “chit-chat”, several were plans and information. Part-way down the second page, I found what I was looking for and have tried to copy it here pretty much as my aunt had written it, adding parentheses with italics where I thought explanation was important. Here's part of what she wrote to my dad:

My memorial to Vi (Viola, my mom) would be my outstanding two instances of her complete, simple faith. I was about 16. We were to go to Edgar's to milk the cows when they were away. We were to HAVE to be there before dark to go to the pasture and bring in the cows because Edgar warned us that they NEVER came in of their own accord and that we could not find them in the dark and that two of them were 'fresh' and HAD to be milked. SOOOO as usual we were late and were plodding along in the buggy with old Brownie putzing along and it was dark before we were half way. I was having a fit worrying about it. She was calm... said “Don't worry, they'll be there, I've prayed.” Hmmm. I thought, God can't push the cows home and furthermore it's our fault for being late ...so why should He help etc. etc. etc. I was up-tight. She was relaxed. We pulled in LONG after dark and milking time, got the lantern, and the cows were all hanging their heads over the fences in the cow lot.

Again, when Paul (Mom's third child) was a baby he was to go to Rochester for treatment on that foot. Paul Sr. (the letter-writer's husband) and I (the letter-writer) had driven her and for some reason, we were returning late at night and coming across the old cut-off, god-forsaken, Po Dunk, road cutting through the empty country north of the east church .. no town for many miles ... a few scattered houses back in the fields. With nothing before nor behind for miles, we ran out of gas. At 2:00 A.M. And the baby crying in the back seat Paul Sr. and I were in a state of “NOW WHAT?” Viola was calm and there we were. Soon she said, “Paul, walk down to the filling station ahead.” We who lived in the area knew that a farmer about a mile down the road had a gas tank on his place and that people in the countryside could sometimes get gas there if they needed it. Well, at 2:00 A.M. this didn't seem like much of a solution to either Paul or me and Paul really thought it was a pretty crazy idea. But, he started out ahead down the dark road and Vi explained to him JUST where it was located etc. We sat in the car, me hoping that a car would come along, but none ever did. After the normal length of time that it would take to walk the distance and back, here came Paul carrying a can. I couldn't believe it but Vi wasn't surprised. She knew all the time. The poor old farmer had been wakened out of a sound sleep with the concern that maybe he hadn't locked his gas tank, and he had no rest until he got up and dressed and was crossing the field with his lantern in his hand getting to the gas tank with perfect timing just as Paul reached it. Well, the tank was locked and everything OK but he was there to give Paul the gas right on time just like the Hamilton Watch ... not a minute off. Paul always said that opened his eyes like nothing else ever had. Isn't that a striking story!!!! Her passing is making me more aware of realizing that same kind of faith. I mean of trying to.

That's the end of my Aunt's letter, but I want to add an example from my own life, just to remind myself that Mom's kind of faith is still alive and available. One evening, when our kids were teens, they drove to the movie theater in a neighboring town. Later, about the time the show would have been over, our phone rang and I suddenly began shivering. But the phone call wasn't about an accident involving them, but a summons to the city in a neighboring state...to the hospital where our college son had been taken following an accident in which he was a passenger. A second passenger, his girlfriend, had died in the accident.

Trembling, I quickly gathered what I thought I might need when my husband, Larry, stopped short.

"We can't take the 'bug' that far and the kids have the station wagon," he said. We pondered for a minute or so when he added, "We have to change cars. The movie must be out by now and the kids will be on their way home." We would have to try to intercept them coming our way somewhere on the road, but there was more than one way between home and the theater. We would have to guess their route and risk missing them entirely. We both prayed as we squeezed into the 'bug'. Larry "had a feeling" about which route to take and praying, we left.

Yes, we met them, were able to stop them, changed cars and proceeded (still thanking and praying) to the distant hospital where we found our son injured and shaken, but up and walking. "Luck", you say? Just as there is no coincidence, there is no luck. It's God at work.

We know that God is always there in every situation. But stop for a moment and ask yourself whether or not you KNOW it! If we feel God there before us and around us, and even within us, how can we not believe Him when He reminds us, "Not one sparrow (What do they cost? Two for a penny?) can fall to the ground without your Father knowing it. And the very hairs of your head are all numbered. So don't worry! You are more valuable to him than many sparrows." Matt 10:29-31 TLB

And just a thought from Max Lucado: Faith is not the belief that God will do what you want. Faith is the belief that God will do what is right.

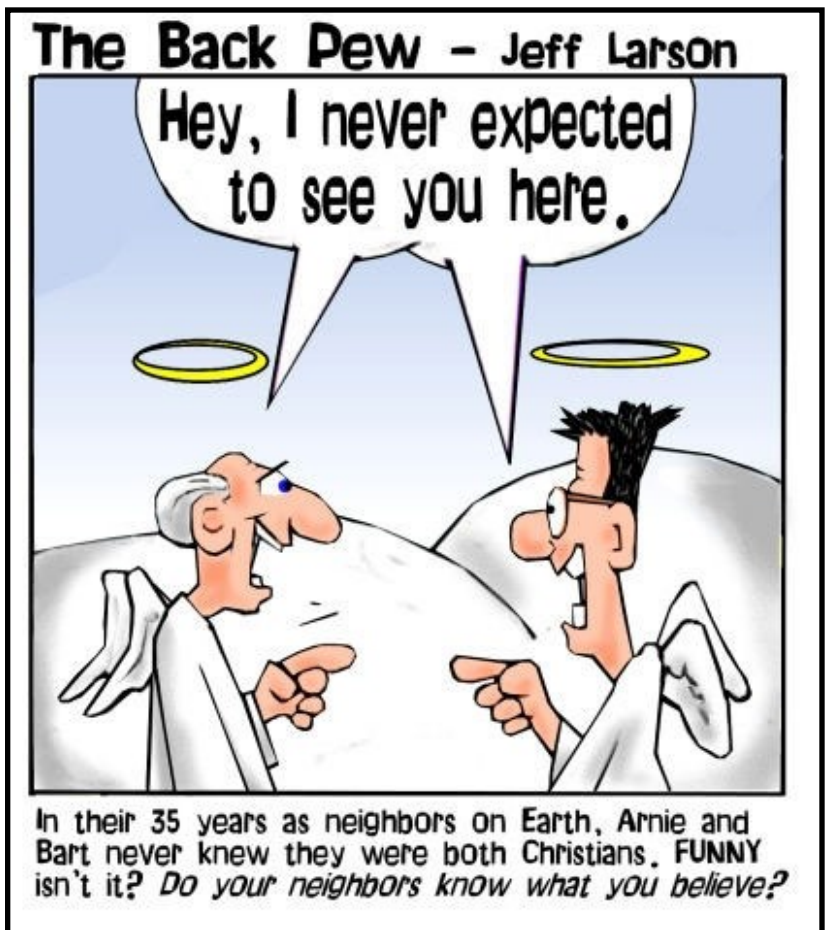
